# Archival Training Collaborative (ATC)

Under the direction of Dr. Elizabeth H. Dow, who heads the archives track in the School of Library and Information Science, Louisiana State University received \$280,000 in federal grant funds to spearhead a three-year effort to establish a sustainable archival training program for individuals responsible for historical records in the states of Louisiana, Mississippi, and Alabama.

- ◆ develop an organizational and financial structure for continuing archival training opportunities after the grant ends
